A Monumental Improvement	The Monumental Improvement project has been developed to nurture heritage in Cornwall's protected landscape. It focuses on providing a more supportive future for 38 Scheduled Monuments (5 are located on the Lizard) which will soon be lost forever if they do not receive urgent care. The sites span over 4,000 years of Cornish history, with some Scheduled Monuments predating the pyramids. Iron Age hill forts and Neolithic settlements feature alongside Medieval moats and bailey castles, whilst some have iconic associations with St Piran and the legendary King Arthur. This two-year project will seek to ensure that the 38 Scheduled Monuments in the Cornwall National Landscape are better identified, supported and enjoyed by a wide range of people. It will focus on removing as many of the sites from the Heritage at Risk Register as possible and provide training for local volunteers to help care for the Monuments in the future. Protected Landscape Investment Bank	This project was initiated as farmers and landowners were facing a reduction, and eventual loss, of basic payment (BPS) against a backdrop of uncertainty as information on new environment land management schemes was unknown. This posed a potential threat to farm businesses as they currently operated, and in turn posed a potential threat to natural capital resources on-farm. In our Discovery process we identified a potential £15m natural capital and ecosystem service benefits could be available on the Lizard - Section 08, South Coast Western. In this study we calculated that for every £1 of public money spent there would be a £3 return on investment. In the event that government schemes would not be able to provide the amount needed to realise this return we looked to understand if private investment and blended finance could form the solution to sustainable and successful farm businesses, whilst delivering more for nature, building resilience to/ mitigating climate change and enhancing landscape character and heritage. Structuring the protected landscape for private investment required a feasibility study to understand how this might be achievable. Lizard Farm for Nature	The aim of this project is to initiate the practical actions on farms identified in the Landscape Management Framework created during the Farming for the Nation Test Trial on the Lizard and deliver to realise and deliver the full framework.
